And God said, "Let the earth sprout vegetation, plants yielding seed, and fruit trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind, on the earth." And it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed according to their own kinds, and trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the third day.

March is the time of the year many people begin to think about working in the yard and enjoying the plants and animals coming back to life. Spring is a special time, yet every season has its own importance. The summer provides heat and long days creating an abundance. Every fall, God lays cover over the soil to protect the earth. Yet, the ground below is full of activity breaking down the foliage, preparing the soil for growing new plants in the spring. The winter days move to less daylight and lead to a depletion of minerals in our diets. As winter gives way to spring, buds and new life appear. Within days, trees and grasses abound with green foliage. These leaves reach out to gather sunlight and carbon dioxide, turning it into produce. Plants use their roots to bring minerals up from the ground filling fruits and vegetables with nutrients.

Consider asparagus. Asparagus is a perennial that returns each year without the need to replant. With no prompting and almost forgotten, asparagus shows up in the spring providing us with much needed minerals from roots that go 10 to 14 feet under ground. The strength of these minerals are strong, as noticed in the odor.

Every plant was created with a purpose *each according to its own kind* and *yielding seed according to their own kinds*.

Ten minutes after picking fruits and vegetables eighty percent of the nutrients are lost. This is why garden produce tastes so much better than supermarket.
