My daughter and her family live in Harris County along a somewhat major road. She lives right beside an elementary school, so traffic picks up at times during the day. One day in March, she had been home for a bit when the weather alert came on. Severe wind and rain were likely across her area. Afternoon storms are frequent during the spring, and flooding can be a real problem. Suddenly, she heard a huge crack and thump. One of the trees had broken off and was laying across the roadway blocking it completely. As she quickly secured the kids in the house and went through her thoughts on how she was supposed to get HER tree out of the road, neighbors arrived to help. Hatchets and chainsaws appeared from everywhere, and they all got to work. The group worked through as the storm slowly subsided getting the tree off the road and allowing traffic to pass. The people took turns attacking a huge problem as if they had worked together all their lives. Chopping up and removing a tree of that size is not an easy task as some of you may personally have the experience.

She said having each of these people (some she barely knew) come to her aid was meaningful in so many ways. One neighbor, who always keeps his Christmas lights up way past Christmas commented, "Maybe HOA will get off my back for a while." She thought how we judge people and circumstances more often than we should.

I questioned why so many hatchets were readily available in the city. She felt that after the Harvey flood, people wanted to be sure they could get out of their homes from the roof.

We never know when we will need assistance or be called upon to assist.
